This is the third of the three workshops with Brooke. This workshop will cover tips for selecting details and making vivid descriptions and imagery. According to actor and writer John Hodgman, "specificity is the soul of narrative". Find out how to create the precise, well-placed details and evocative descriptions that help bring a story to life.

Brooke Dunnell is a Perth-born writer whose fiction has been published in the anthologies *Best Australia Stories*, *New Australian Stories 2, Fire* (Margaret River Press) and *All-nighter* (Cardigan Press), as well as the journals *Westerly*, Meanjin, Westerly, :etchings melb and Voiceworks.

She has a PhD in Creative Writing from the University of Western Australia and has experience as an undergraduate creative writing tutor, workshop presenter and editorial assistant. Brooke was our 2016 Writer-in-Residence. Her short stories have been commended in 2013 FAWWA Hadow/Stuart Short Story Competition and the 2004 University of Canberra National Short Story Competition and twice read on ABC Radio National.
